Qualifications

- A degree in Real Estate, Business, Commerce, Economics, Public Administration, or a discipline related to Property Assessment.
- At least 8 years of experience in assessment, appraisal, or taxation with experience interpreting legislation and undertaking professional practice.
- Equivalent combinations of experience and education may be considered.
- A professional assessment or appraisal designation, such as Accredited Municipal Assessor of Alberta (AMAA), Accredited Appraiser Canadian Institute (AACI) or Certified Assessment Evaluator (CAE).
- Previous leadership experience including leading change is required.
- You demonstrate the 4 C's of: Character (behaving the right way), Competence (doing the right things the right way), Commitment (dedication to the greater public good), and Collaboration (working together for a common purpose).
